Summer Scoring Institute

Thanks to all the remarkable teachers who worked this summer to score just over 7,000 portfolios. This feat was accomplished in just 10 days by 275 teachers.

New Resource Guide

The 2006 Resource Guide to the Massachusetts Curriculum Frameworks for Students with Disabilities is coming in October! The new version includes:

- History and Social Science standards for PreK-grade 8, World History I and II, and U.S. History I and II
- Revised high school standards for Science and Technology/Engineering
- Suggested access skills for each standard for students who are not yet ready to access the curriculum directly
- Updated entry points and instructional ideas

The 2007 Educator's Manual is now posted!

Print copies of the 2007 Educator's Manual for MCAS-Alt, including a one-page summary of changes for 2007, will be available at fall training sessions and is currently posted online.

An Order Form for the Resource Guide and the Educator's Manual will be posted online in mid-October.

Forms and Graphs Online Coming Soon

MCAS-Alt digital forms, graphs, and work description labels will be available again this year. These will allow educators to complete forms on the computer and print them for inclusion in their students' portfolios. Student information is entered more easily, and is replicated on each form, graph, and label, so teachers spend less time filling out paperwork. You will have a choice of either a "download" version (for use on a single computer) or a "Web-based" version (for use on multiple computers, with information stored on a secure Web site). 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Here are some important suggestions for getting started on MCAS-Alt student portfolios this school year:

- **Start early!** Check IEPs to determine which students will be taking MCAS-Alt and become familiar with the academic outcomes listed for each student. Think about the skills you will teach this year and which ones are appropriate to include in the portfolio.
- **Consider the level at which a student can access the curriculum**. The Resource Guide provides entry points and access skills for addressing academic skills and content. (Note: Always start at the most challenging level for a student).
- Consider how you will set up data charts to measure skills in each subject. Data will help you track a student's progress over a period of time, but make certain to show that the student is learning a new skill and not one in which he or she is already accurate and independent.
