

Results of Online Feedback Survey – October 14, 2009

Title I Technical Assistance and Networking Session

The Department would like to thank all respondents for taking the time to complete the online evaluation of the October 14, 2009 Title I Technical Assistance and Networking Session. Your feedback is greatly appreciated as we seek to improve the delivery of Title I technical assistance.

Participant Information

Seventy-three participants responded to the survey. The majority of respondents (85%) are from districts with one to five Title I schools. Approximately 32% of districts have an FY10 Title I grant between \$100,000 and \$299,000. Over half of the attendees (59%) have been responsible for a district's Title I program for three or more years. The majority of respondents (78%) hold the position of Title I Director, but many hold other roles as well, including Director of Curriculum and Instruction (26%), Grant Manager (26%), and Assistant Superintendent (15%).
