
• To be successful, by 2025-2026:

RTAP Goals

Prepare Effective Educators to Have Impact and Thrive

Expand Pipelines into Hard-to-Staff Roles

Key Program Features

- Earn While You Learn: RTAP combines paid, on-the-job training with academic coursework, allowing participants to earn income while working toward their teaching licensure.
- **Mentorship & Support:** Each apprentice is paired with an experienced SP who provides guidance, feedback, and support throughout the program, as well as a program supervisor from a partner EPP to support meaningful application of coursework to practice throughout their apprenticeship term.
- Culturally and Linguistically Sustaining Practices (CLSP): RTAP includes training in culturally and linguistically sustaining practices for both SPs and apprentices, ensuring that all educators are equipped to meet the needs of diverse student populations.
- **Flexibility:** The program is designed to accommodate participants' full-time employment in conjunction with coursework requirements, making it accessible to individuals who are working or have other commitments.
- **Diverse Pathways:** Whether you are a recent graduate, a career changer, or a paraprofessional looking to become a teacher, RTAP can provide tailored pathways to licensure through job-embedded, comprehensive supports and preparation.

Planned Updates to Align Guidelines

This year, we plan to update several Guidelines to bring them into alignment with the 2023 Guidelines for Program Approval and the 2024 Guidelines for PST and CAP. Each of these is in the early stages, with outreach and input to begin this fall. We will continue to update our Ed Prep page with more details on the timelines.
