My time at the Department during the last school year was brief; as you know, I became commissioner in April. After recognizing a Teacher of the Year who inspired more than a dozen of his students to become math teachers, we have continued to find new ways to celebrate teachers and look forward to more recognition and recruitment efforts.

In future annual reports, you can expect to hear more from me about our efforts to narrow the state's persistent achievement gaps and promote racial equity, diversity, and cultural proficiency within our agency and the Commonwealth's schools.
