



Appleseeds: Evidence-Based Foundational Skills for Massachusetts: Learning Series Overview and Registration

September 2022

Overview

Grounded in the belief that high-quality instructional materials can support excellence with equity, the Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (MA DESE) is committed to expanding access to stronger curricular materials as a powerful way to narrow opportunity gaps and accelerate student learning at scale. In the fall of 2022, they will release *Appleseeds: Evidence-Based Foundational Skills for Massachusetts*, an open-source curricular resource that is aligned with the standards for Reading Foundational Skills and reflects the evidence-based practices outlined in the state's vision for excellent early literacy instruction, and in the [Mass Literacy Guide](#).

While the primary purpose of this resource is to equip in-service educators with instructional materials that will support evidence-based practice and bring the Mass Literacy Guide to life, an open-source curricular resource also presents an opportunity to improve pre-service preparation. EPP faculty can leverage this resource to support pre-service educators to gain deep knowledge of literacy development and to skillfully implement evidence-based, inclusive, culturally responsive practices for the teaching of reading using high-quality instructional materials and assessments. DESE's goal is that by SY2024-2025, all Early Childhood, Elementary, and Moderate Disabilities teacher candidates in Massachusetts are prepared, through coursework and opportunities for practice and high-quality feedback, in evidence-based early literacy as outlined in the Mass Literacy Guide.

Appleseeds Professional Learning Series (October 2022 - January 2023)

To that end, the Department is partnering with [TNTP](#) from October 2022 to January 2023 to provide a learning series designed to provide EPP faculty with professional development related to the design and intent of Appleseeds, and how faculty might integrate this resource into coursework and/or opportunities for clinical practice and high-quality feedback.

Who should consider participating?

- ✓ Faculty from programs that prepare teachers for Elementary, Early Childhood or Moderate Disabilities licenses.
- ✓ Faculty that teach Methods and/or Curriculum and Instruction Courses focused on elementary or early childhood literacy/ ELA, especially those that introduce evidence-based practices for foundational skills.
- ✓ Faculty that supervise and give teacher candidates feedback during clinical practice opportunities in K-2 ELA classrooms.
- ✓ Faculty that have an interest in integrating Appleseeds: Evidence-Based Foundational Skills for Massachusetts into their coursework and/or opportunities for clinical practice and high-quality feedback and want to learn more.
- ✓ Faculty that can devote approximately 8 hours to the learning series from October 2022 - January 2023.
