- The Assessment was open for 13 days from Tuesday, October 31, 2023 to Monday, November 13, 2023.
- The initial invitation was sent the field on Tuesday, October 31, 2023 with a reminder email sent on Thursday, November 9, 2023.
- DESE received 99 complete responses and 128 partial responses.
- The information provided below was compiled from the pool of complete responses.

Demographics of Responding Private Schools


- The majority of schools serve students in grades PK-8.

Respondents ranked mental health/social emotional supports as the highest priority student need, followed by differentiated instruction and improving academic performance.
