Subject:	Updated In-District Services for Circuit Breaker Claiming

The Department of Elementary and Secondary Education will roll out a new special education Circuit Breaker claim system in 2025. This upgrade will provide an online platform for districts to claim expenses for reimbursement through the Circuit Breaker program and will replace use of an Excel-based claim file.

As part of this transition, the Department has updated the list of services to be used when claiming in-district and supplemental services.

The categories and types of services that are qualified for reimbursement through the circuit breaker program have not changed. However, the in-district service names have been updated to more accurately reflect current naming conventions and provide additional specificity. Our goal is to make it easier for districts to describe and be reimbursed for special education services being provided to students.

The second page of this memo provides the updated in-district services list along with FY25 rates. These will be available for claiming beginning with FY25 circuit breaker relief in March 2025. Additionally, an <u>in-district services calculator</u> is available on the circuit breaker website as a tool to help districts identify where in-district expenses meet or exceed the claiming threshold of \$52,419 for FY25.
