AWARD INFORMATION

Incorporation: In addition to the federal laws, regulations, policies, and CDC General Terms and Conditions for Non-research awards at https://www.cdc.gov/grants/federal-regulations-policies/index.html, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) hereby incorporates Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) numbernumber DP18-1801, entitled Improving Student Health and Academic Achievement through Nutrition, Physical Activity and the Management of Chronic Contidions in Schools, and application dated March 1, 2022, as may be amended, which are hereby made a part of this Non-research award, hereinafter referred to as the Notice of Award (NoA).

Approved Funding: Funding in the amount of \$365,000 is approved for the **Year 5** budget period, which is **June 30, 2022** through **June 29, 2023**. All future year funding will be based on satisfactory programmatic progress and the availability of funds.

Financial Assistance Mechanism: Cooperative Agreement

Substantial Involvement by CDC: This is a cooperative agreement and CDC will have substantial programmatic involvement after the award is made. Substantial involvement is in addition to all post-award monitoring, technical assistance, and performance reviews undertaken in the normal course of stewardship of federal funds.

CDC program staff will assist, coordinate, or participate in carrying out effort under the award, and recipients agree to the responsibilities therein, as detailed in the NOFO. The CDC program will work in partnership with the awardee to ensure the success of the cooperative agreement by:

- Supporting awardees in implementing cooperative agreement requirements and meeting program outcomes;
- Providing technical assistance to revise annual work plans;
- Assisting awardees in advancing program activities to achieve project outcomes:
- Providing scientific subject matter expertise and resources;
- Collaborating with awardees to develop and implement evaluation plans that align with CDC evaluation activities:
- Providing technical assistance on awardees' evaluation and performance measurement plan;
- Providing technical assistance to define and operationalize performance measures;
- Providing professional development and training opportunities either in person or through virtual web-based training formats – for the purpose of sharing the latest science, best practices, success stories, and program models;
- Participating in relevant meetings, committees, conference calls, and working groups related to the cooperative agreement requirements to achieve outcomes;
- Providing surveillance technical assistance and state-specific data collected by CDC;
- Providing technical expertise to other CDC programs and Federal agencies on how to interface with grantees;
- Translating and disseminating lessons learned through publications, meetings, and other means on promising and best practices to expand the evidence base; and
- Hosting a grantee meeting during the first year of the project period and subsequently later in the project period for a total of up to five meetings.

Expanded Authority: The recipient is permitted the following expanded authority in the administration of the award.

☑ Carryover of unobligated balances from one budget period to a subsequent budget period. Unobligated funds may be used for purposes within the scope of the project as originally approved. Recipients will report use, or intended use, of unobligated funds in Section 12 "Remarks" of the annual Federal Financial Report. If the GMO determines that some or all of the unobligated funds are not necessary to complete the project, the GMO may restrict the recipient's authority to automatically carry over unobligated balances in the future, use the balance to reduce or offset CDC funding for a subsequent budget period, or use a combination of these actions.

FUNDING RESTRICTIONS AND LIMITATIONS

Indirect Costs:

Indirect costs are approved based on the negotiated indirect cost rate agreement dated June 29, 2021 which calculates indirect costs as follows: a Predetermined rate is approved at 10.1% of the base, Modified Total Direct Cost – Total direct costs excluding equipment, capital expenditures, participant support costs, pass-through funds and the portion of each subaward (subcontract or subgrant) above \$25,000 (each award, each year). The effective dates of this indirect cost rate are from July 1, 2021 to June 30, 2023.
