Dear Friends:

I am pleased to issue the annual publication, *Plans of High School Graduates: Class of 2002*. This report provides information on the post-graduation plans of Massachusetts public high school students who graduated in 2002. The data in this document, along with several other educational indicators that we report, help to inform decision-making at both local and state levels.

For the Class of 2002, over 74 percent of Massachusetts high school graduates plan to continue their education at a two- or four-year college. This figure has shown steady growth from 53 percent recorded over twenty years ago. Correspondingly, 13 percent of graduates plan to work, approximately half of the percentage planning to work in 1980.

The Education Reform Act of 1993, with its high standards for students and teachers, will strengthen the efforts of Massachusetts schools and districts in preparing students to successfully pursue their post-graduation plans.

Introduction

The Massachusetts Department of Education collects data annually from public high schools regarding the plans of their graduates. This report summarizes the data at the state level for the Class of 2002 and includes analyses by racial/ethnic groups, gender, vocational-technical schools, and charter schools. Comparison data from past years are also provided, as well as district and individual school data. It is important to note that the data represent the <u>intentions</u> of high school graduates and may not reflect what students actually do after graduating from high school.

Changes in Data Collection

Prior to the 2001-02 school year, data about the plans of high school graduates were obtained from the Year-End School Indicator Report, a survey of Massachusetts public schools conducted by the Department of Education at the end of each school year. School officials reported the number of graduating students by gender and race across nine categories of post-graduation plans.

In 2001-02, Massachusetts changed its collection system and began collecting student-level data through the Student Information Management System (SIMS). This report marks the first year that the plans of high school graduates are reported based on student-level data submitted by districts through SIMS. As a result of this new collection method, data may not fully represent actual changes in the plans of high school graduates from previous years, but rather may be representative of changes in data collection and in reporting requirements. Despite these limitations, student-level data collected through SIMS for this and the following years will ensure more accurate reporting by districts and will allow for more in-depth analysis of the plans of high school graduates in Massachusetts.

Results

• Class of 2002


Figure 1. Plans of 2002 High School Graduates*

In 2002, a total of 56,930 students graduated from Massachusetts public high schools. Of these graduates, over 74 percent planned on attending college or some other post-secondary institution (e.g. trade schools), 13 percent planned on working, and two percent intended to enter the military. One percent of the graduates reported having plans other than the ones listed above, and data was not available for the remaining nine percent of graduates (Figure 1 and Table 1). Of the graduates planning to attend college, more than twice as many planned to attend a four-year college than planned to attend a two-year college (52 versus 20 percent of all graduates).



- 2% planned to attend other post-secondary schools




Graduates Planning to Attend College




Trends over Time

The percentage of graduates planning to attend college has increased over the past twenty years, from 54 percent in 1982, to 68 percent in 1992, and to over 72 percent of all graduates in 2002 (Table 2). Between 1982 and 2002, the percentage of graduates planning to attend a two-year college increased from



16 percent to 20 percent, and the percentage planning to attend a four-year college rose from 38 percent to 52 percent. Over that same time period, the percentage of high school graduates intending to enroll in a private college increased from 25 to 32 percent, and the percentage intending to enroll in a public college increased from 29 percent to 41 percent (Figure 2).



While the percentage of graduates planning to attend a private two-year college has slightly decreased since 1977 (from four percent in 1977 to less than three percent in 2002), the percentage planning to attend public two-year colleges has grown from 11 to 18 percent (Figure 3). The percentage of



graduates planning to attend public four-year colleges has shown a general increase over the past 25 years. From 1977 to 2002, the percentage of graduates planning to attend a private four-year college has shown the highest increase, from 19 to 29 percent. However, this increase occurred primarily between 1977 to 1992, and has remained relatively stable over the past 10 years.

As the percentage of graduates planning to attend college has increased, the percentage of graduates planning to work, attend some other post-secondary institution, or enter the military has decreased (Figure 4). The percentage of graduates planning to work fell from 32 percent in 1977 to 13 percent in 2002. The




percentage of graduates planning to attend a non-college, post-secondary institution decreased from six to two percent, and the percentage planning to enter the military decreased from four to two percent over the same time period.

The percentage of graduates with plans reported as "data not available" increased from three percent in 2001 to nine percent in 2002 (Table 2). The increase in this category can most likely be contributed to changes in the data collection system. It is expected that the percentage of plans reported as "data not available" will decrease as districts become more familiar with the process of reporting student-level data through SIMS. For 2002, the increase in "data not available" may have caused all other categories to show slight decreases from past years.


• Racial/Ethnic Groups

Post-graduate plans also varied according to racial/ethnic group (Figure 5). In 2002 the percentage of Asian graduates planning to attend a two- or four-year college (79 percent) was higher than that of white graduates (75 percent), African-American graduates



(64 percent), Native American graduates (60 percent), and Hispanic graduates (54 percent). The percentage of graduates planning to attend public colleges ranged by race/ethnicity from 36 percent (Hispanic) to 42 percent (White). The percentage of those planning to attend private colleges ranged from 18 percent (Hispanic) to 39 percent (Asian).


In each of the racial/ethnic groups reported, the percentage of graduates planning to attend college has fluctuated over the past ten years (Figure 6). Between 1992 and 2002, the percentage of African-American graduates planning to attend college increased from 61 to 64 percent, and for white graduates the percentage increased from 69 to 75 percent. The percentage of Hispanic graduates planning to attend college has remained relatively steady over the past ten years (54 percent in both 1992 and 2002), while the percentage of Asian graduates has fluctuated (83 percent in 1992, 84 percent in 1997, and 79 percent in 2002. For Native Americans, the



percentage decreased from 66 to 60 percent over the past ten years. However, the rate for Native American students is susceptible to wide fluctuation due to a low number enrolled in Massachusetts public schools.

• Gender


In the 2002 graduating class, 79 percent of female graduates planned to attend a twoor four-year college, compared to 67 percent of male graduates, while a higher percentage of male graduates than female graduates (17 versus nine percent) intended to work (Table 1). Over four times as many males as females planned to enter the military (approximately four to one percent). These differences extend a gender pattern seen in recent years. In the last ten years, females have consistently



planned to attend college at a higher rate (approximately 13 percentage points) than males, but each gender has increasingly planned to attend college over this time period (Figure 7).

• Race/Ethnicity and Gender

The disparity between the percentages of female and male graduates planning to attend college also varies by race/ethnicity (Figure 8). In each racial/ethnic group, the percentage of female




graduates planning to attend college was higher than that of male graduates. The largest difference was among Hispanic graduates, with 62 percent of Hispanic female graduates having planned to attend college compared to 46 percent of Hispanic male graduates (a

difference of 16 percentage points). The smallest difference was among Asian graduates: within this group 82 percent of female graduates and 77 percent of male graduates planned to attend college.

• Vocational-Technical Schools

6,226 students graduated from Massachusetts public vocational-technical schools in 2002. Of these graduates, 47 percent planned on working, 24 percent planned to attend a two-year college, and 13 percent planned to attend a four-year college. Four percent of these graduates intended to enter the military, two percent planned to attend some other type of post-secondary institution, two percent reported having plans other than those listed above, and data was not available for the remaining eight percent (Figure 9).


The percentage of vocational-technical school graduates planning to work after graduation was more than three times greater than graduates from all school types (47 versus 13 percent). The percentage of vocational-technical school graduates planning to attend a 2-year college was also greater than the percentage of graduates from all school types with the same plans (24 versus 20 percent). The percentage of vocational-technical school



graduates intending to enter the military was also greater than graduates from all school types (four versus two percent)

Charter Schools

Of the 12 charter schools reporting graduates in 2002, there were a total of 361 graduates. Of this total, 69 percent planned to attend a 4-year college, 17 percent planned to attend a 2-year college, six percent intended to work, and two percent planned to enter the military. Additionally, two percent planned to attend some other type of post-secondary institution, one percent had plans other than those listed above, and data was not available for three percent (Figure 10).



The 69 percent of charter school graduates planning to attend a 4-year college was higher than the 52 percent of graduates from all school types with the same post-graduate intentions. The percentage of charter school graduates planning to attend two-year college (17 percent) and the percentage intending to work (six percent) were both less than the percentage of graduates from all school types (20 percent and 13 percent respectively).

• Reporting by Individual Schools and Districts

Consistent with past reports, the data table beginning on page 9 presents the Plans of High School Graduates: Class of 2002 by district and school. The schools in this data table are classified as follows:

- Academic High Schools (A) offer academic courses, both college preparatory and general.
- Comprehensive High Schools (C) offer academic courses and at least five Chapter 74 approved occupational education programs.
- Vocational High Schools (V) offer Chapter 74 approved vocational-technical education programs.
