During the 2024-25 school year, Massachusetts schools can apply to pilot Investigating History materials in their grades 3 & 4 classrooms. Pilot teachers and students will provide valuable feedback in order to strengthen the materials before their public release in Summer 2025.

Investigating History is fully aligned with the 2018 History/Social Science Framework. All materials have been reviewed by educators, scholars, and experts.

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Investigating History



Participating pilot schools will receive

- Comprehensive social studies curriculum materials -- including lesson plans, slide decks, and student handouts
- Full-day, in-person professional development sessions for each unit
- Funding, pending availability, to:
 - Provide a \$500 stipend for each teacher who participates fully in the pilot, which will require traveling to six in-person PD days and planning outside of school hours to implement the curriculum
 - Cover the cost of substitute teachers for professional development sessions held on school days
- The opportunity to shape curricular materials that will ultimately be used in hundreds of classrooms across Massachusetts



Pilot Details

Schools can choose to pilot Investigating History in either or both grade levels, although priority will be given to schools who apply to pilot the materials in both grades and/or across all classrooms in a grade.

Each Investigating History course includes five units of roughly 20-25, 30-minute lessons.

Pilot Commitments

Participating schools must commit to:

- **Sending** all participating classroom teachers to six days of in-person professional development, held in Central Massachusetts
 - August sessions (two days) will tentatively be held the week of August 19
 - Remaining PD sessions will be held on school days; *pending availability, funding will be available for substitute coverage*
- **Teaching** units and lessons as designed, with some allowable adaptations
- Scheduling at least 90 minutes per week, on average, for dedicated social studies instruction
- **Providing** feedback to DESE and the curriculum developers regularly throughout the pilot
- **Engaging** with a third-party evaluation (e.g. classroom observations, focus groups, surveys, etc.) to support our continuous improvement of the curriculum

Please apply for the pilot only if you are confident you can meet these commitments. In advance of the materials' release in Summer 2025, there will be other opportunities to explore the curriculum more informally throughout the 2024-25 school year. <u>Sign up here for updates!</u>
