This report provides the results from the November 2021 next-generation Massachusetts Comprehensive Assessment System (MCAS) retest administration in English Language Arts (ELA) and/or Mathematics. Students were eligible to participate in the November retest for graduation purposes and for scholarship purposes.

Students in the class of 2023 must meet the following requirements to be eligible for a high school diploma:

- earn a scaled score of 472 or higher on the MCAS ELA test or retest; or earn a scaled score of 455–471 on the ELA test or retest and fulfill the requirements of an Educational Proficiency Plan (EPP) in ELA
- earn a scaled score of 486 or higher on the Mathematics test or retest; or earn a scaled score of 469-485 on the Mathematics test or retest **and** fulfill the requirements of an EPP in Mathematics
- meet the Science and Technology/Engineering MCAS requirement, as follows:
- earn a scaled score of 220 (Needs Improvement) or higher on the February 2020 Biology test; or
- earn credit in a relevant course in biology, chemistry, introductory physics, or technology/engineering, as certified by the school district, during the student's high school career.

In addition to the above MCAS requirements, students must meet all local graduation requirements in order to earn a high school diploma.

For students who did not earn a passing score in one or both subjects, the next testing opportunity in ELA will be March 9-10, and the next testing opportunity in Mathematics will be March 15-16. If necessary, please contact your school's guidance office to register for the appropriate test.






