
The following tables and map show the results of the 1976 congressional and presidential elections.

1976 Presidential Election Results

Candidate	Political Party	Electoral Votes	Popular Votes
Jimmy Carter	Democratic	297	40,825,839
Gerald Ford	Republican	240	39,147,770



Score Point 1A*

It was important during the 1976 presidential campaigns to visit different states because you needed to win a states popular vote to earn its electoral college votes. Larger populated states were needed the most because the more populated states had more electoral college votes. Although New York is a smaller state compared to Texas, it still had 15 more electoral votes than Texas. Jimmy Carter and Gerald Ford had a similar amount of states won, but Jimmy Carter had campaigned in the more populated areas and won more electoral votes from it. Overall it is extremely important to visit states and campaign so that you can win a states electoral college votes to be elected president. Without visiting states and campaigning your ideas and improvements for the country, than people in that state will not vote for you because they do not have much knowledge on what you believe in or stand for. It is extremely important and needed to interact with the people and visit states to campaign.

Score Point 1B*

It's important for caandidates to vist different states because, in the table above it shows that Jimmy Carter visited Florida and Texas more than his opponent Gerald Ford. This makes a huge impact because when we then look, at source 3 Texas and Florida is in blue. This means when a candidate vists different states more, they will more likely get more votes by the people, for gaining their love, and trust.
