Student Sergeant of Arms escorts Governor Healey to the podium.



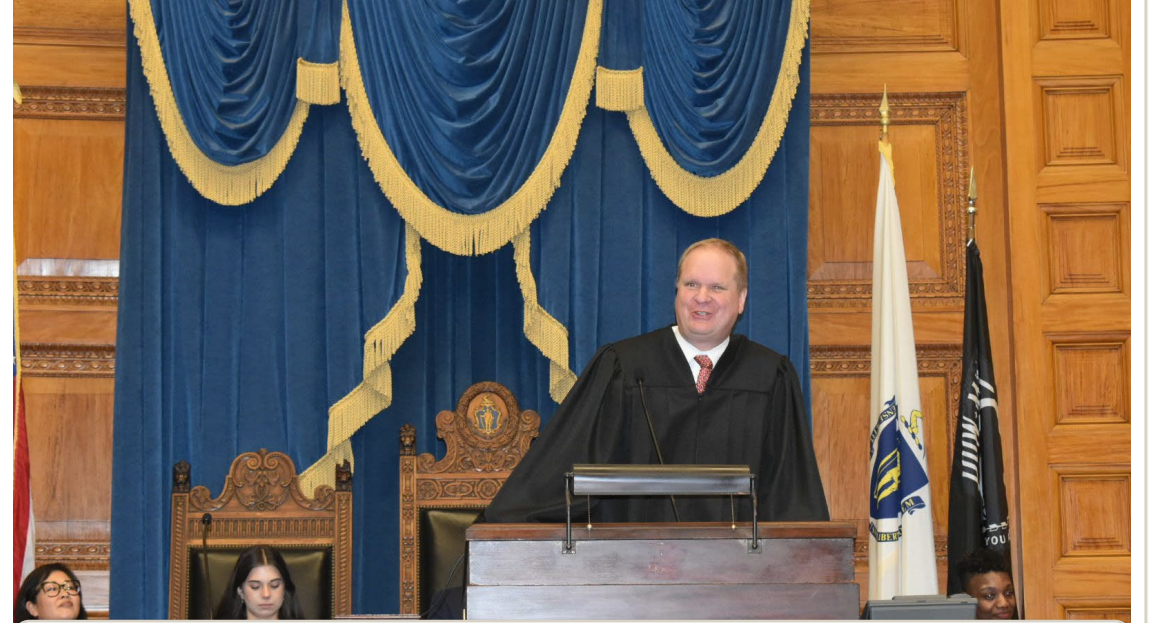
Introductions and remarks kept the program moving forward.
